How to read graduation rates:

Example: Fall Semester 1998, 1,716 first-time, full-time, degree-seeking freshmen enrolled at UNO. They compose the 1998 Fall Cohort.

- After 6 years, 421 students, or 25% of the original cohort of 1716, graduated from UNO
- After 8 years, 508 students, or 30% of the original cohort of 1716, graduated from UNO

U. S. Dept of Education defines the cohort as that group of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking freshmen who enroll in a specific fall semester

An academic year consists of Fall, Spring, and Summer.
